Welcome to the April edition of the Kambu Health Communique.

Sadly, this week Australia recognised the sad passing of Senior Yolngu lore man and Gumatj clan leader, Yunupingu. Yunupingu, one of our most respected and influential Indigenous leaders and a champion for indigenous rights. Prime Minister Anthony Albanese has called Yolngu Elder Yunupingu a "man who stood tall in his beloved country and worked to lift our entire continent in the process" in a touching tribute to the Indigenous land rights leader. "Yunupingu walked in two worlds with authority, power, and grace, and he worked to make them whole - together," Albanese said in a statement.

Yunupingu passed away aged 74 in north-east Arnhem Land in the Northern Territory following a long illness. Our thoughts are with his family and loved ones during this difficult time.

The Kambu Health community has had much sadness over the last couple of weeks with the passing of two people. As we do, we have wrapped our hands and hearts around those families and supported them through these difficult times. Kambu Health takes a moment to reflect on sorry business and remember the need to tell those near and dear we love them, and we are here for them.

On behalf of the Board, CEO, and all staff we remember the loved ones of those in our community, friends, family, colleagues and we send our prayers.

As we approach Easter, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the significance of this holiday and its message of hope and renewal. 

Jagera, Yuggera and Ugarapul Peoples.


We recognise their contribution to the health of this place, their custodianship of the lands, waterways, skies, and all that live in it.
