### OUR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT TO COUNTRY




We recognise their contribution to the health of this place, their custodianship of the lands, waterways, skies, and all that live in it.

Did you know that BREAST CANCER is the second most common cause of cancer-related death in Australia?

We know from data that 1 in 8 Queensland women will be diagnosed with breast cancer and 1 in 41 women will die from this disease.

The best way to detect breast cancer is through a Mammogram screening test.

Mammogram is an X-ray test that picks up any small changes in your breast that can be a very early sign of breast cancer. Earlier detection of cancer means we can manage it quickly, therefore preventing cancer-related deaths.

Cancer Council recommends females aged 50 years old - 74 years old to contact BreastScreen Australia for their FREE mammogram every two (2) years.

Women aged 40-49 years old and those over 74 years old are also eligible for FREE mammogram test every two (2) years.

To book an appointment for your mammogram, call BreastScreen Australia on 13 20 50 or <u>CLICK BELOW</u> to find local providers near you.

Also, this upcoming October is Breast cancer awareness month, so let's book ahead for your mammogram and educate our community, loved ones, and families about breast cancer.

By the way, a small number of men can also develop breast cancer so if you have worries, please book an appointment with your local GP at Kambu Health.

Signs of breast cancer include but are not limited to:

- -Lump
- -Breast Thickening
- -Nipple discharge or pain
- -Breast pain
- -Breast skin changes including any change in shape, feel, size, or colour

If you notice any of those changes or any concerns, book an appointment with your GP today at Kambu Health.


